

**Guide to the Oral History of
GREENE, ALEXANDER J. (1923–2010)**

Biographical/Historical Notes

Alexander J. Greene was a Rockville City Council Member and the Mayor of Rockville in Montgomery County. He was raised in eastern Kentucky. During World War II, he served in the Army Air Forces in the Pacific and Atlantic. Following the war, he earned a degree in Economics at the University of Illinois. In 1948, he moved to Washington, D.C. and began his career in the Federal government. He bought a home in Montgomery County in the early 1950s and served as a Rockville City Council Member from 1954 to 1958 and the Mayor of Rockville from 1958 to 1962. He also served on the Rockville Planning Commission from 1962 to 1971 and the Housing Authority of Montgomery County from 1967 to 1974. Greene was an advisor and intergovernmental programs coordinator to Montgomery County Executive Charles Gilchrist in the 1980s. Greene was also a founding member of the Unitarian Church of Rockville.
