Biographical/Historical Notes

Mollie Gladhill was one of the founders of the Farm Women's Cooperative in Bethesda, Maryland. She was born in 1886 in Frederick County, Maryland and lived all of her life in Montgomery County. Her parents grew wheat, corn, and tobacco on their farm near Fountain Mills. Gladhill was involved in founding the Farm Women's Cooperative in 1932 and was founder of the Home Demonstration Club to assist farmers during the Depression.
