

**Guide to the Oral History of
JEWELL, EDGAR GUY (1901-1984)**

Biographical/Historical Notes

Edgar Guy Jewell was an educator and community leader in Montgomery County. He was born in 1901 in Loudoun County, Virginia. He moved to Montgomery County in his early life and attended Barnesville Elementary School and Poolesville High School. He earned a Bachelor's degree at George Washington University and a Master's degree at the University of Maryland. He served in the U.S. Navy in the South Pacific during World War II and worked as a teacher, principal, and administrator in the Montgomery County Public School system for 50 years. He served as President of the Maryland State Teachers Association in 1958 and was a member of numerous community organizations including the Montgomery County Historical Society, American Legion Post #171, the Montgomery County Association of Volunteer Firemen, and the Rockville Rotary Club.
