ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY

In 1961, three young black men, brothers John and James Giles along with Joseph Johnson, were convicted of the rape of a 16-year-old girl and sentenced to the death penalty in the Maryland courts. The Giles brothers' mother had been employed by Montgomery County resident Mrs. Howard Ross, who subsequently formed the 60-member Giles-Johnson defense committee in an effort to bring to light unheard-evidence that put into question the testimony of the alleged victim at the trial. In 1963, due to the efforts of the Committee, Governor Millard Tawes commuted the men's death sentences to life imprisonment. The Committee continued their efforts, claiming the miscarriage of justice and the harsh sentencing was due to the men's race and class. The Giles brothers were retried in 1967 and the charges were dropped. Joseph Johnson was eventually pardoned by Governor Spiro T. Agnew in 1968.

This landmark case was appealed before the Supreme Court; as a result Maryland law was changed to allow motions for trials based on newly-discovered evidence.
